Notice to Secondary One Students and Parents (2018-2019)

(1) Pre-S1 Attainment Tests

In order to assess the S1 students' standards in Chinese, English and Mathematics and assist the class allocation procedures, the Education Bureau (EDB) requires all S1 students in our school to take the Pre-S1 Attainment Tests. Details are as follows:

Date : 17 July (Tue)
Venue : School hall

Subject and time : Mathematics (9:00-9:50) ; English (10:20-11:10)

Chinese (11:40-12:30) ; School-based English Proficiency Test (12:45-13:15)

Remarks:

i. Students should wear their <u>primary school uniforms</u> and arrive at the school hall by **8:30 am**.

Students should bring a) **Allocation Slip** issued by the EDB

b) **Attainment Tests Admission Form** issued by our school (See Appendix 3)

c) stationery

ii. If a tropical cyclone warning No.8 or above, black / red rainstorm warning is issued by the Hong Kong Observatory, the Attainment Tests will be postponed to 18 July at the same venue.

iii. Students may bring water and snacks for consumption during the breaks.

iv. Students are advised to bring a coat.

		Cosmopolitan Youth Camp 2018				
30/7 - 3/8	9:00-16:00	Supported by the EDB, the British Council and various universities, this programme invites British and Canadian university students majoring in education to Hong Kong in summer every year to help students learn English. It aims to motivate students' interest and boost their confidence in using English through a fun and enjoyable day camp on our own campus.				
		Remarks: i. The programme fee is \$800. With school subsidy, each student only needs to pay \$200. ii. The school will arrange lunch box for students. It costs \$22 per meal, totaling \$110. iii. The fee mentioned above will be collected as a miscellaneous fee in the first term.				
		Summer Bridging Course 2018				
	21/8-22/8 8:10-12:30*	Taught by our English teachers, the course aims to help students get used to using English as the medium of instruction by enhancing students' ability in the 4 generic skills and introducing the basic vocabulary of content subjects. Students must wear our summer school uniform.				
21/8 - 23/8	(*23/8: 8:10 - 3:30)	Remarks: i. The course is free of charge. ii. Each day starts with a morning assembly on discipline, morals, or counselling (8:10 – 8:40). The English bridging lesson begins at 8:40. iii. Students must complete the designated summer assignment before the summer bridging programme and study the materials given on the registration day . They should bring back the assignments on 21/8. iv. 23/8 is a simulated school day . The English bridging programme will finish at 11:05 and will be followed by a library orientation (11:20–12:30), lunch with BBS (12:30–13:30) and BBS S1 orientation (13:30–15:30). Students must wear our school summer PE uniform . v. The school will arrange lunchboxes for students on 23/8. The fee (\$22) will be collected as a miscellaneous fee in the first term.

(7) School uniform and PE uniform

Plain-styled scarves and gloves in white/ black/grey/navy blue are allowed on colder days. If the temperature is 12°C or below, plain-styled jackets in white/black/grey/navy blue are allowed; dark grey velvet trousers may also be worn by girls.
